Sworn Reserve Officers, Sworn & Non Sworn Auxiliary, Search and Rescue Teams, Chaplains, Victims Services,

And Generalized Civilian Volunteer Positions such as Citizen Patrol Units and Administrative Support

What Are Citizens on Patrol?

Non-Sworn Citizen Volunteers selected & "hired" by local Police and Sheriffs department

Limited to Full Background Checks completed

Training varies on average from 24 to 40 hours in addition to First Aid and CPR requirements

On average, C.O.P.'s are required to donate from 12 to 16 hours per month

What Are Citizens on Patrol?

C.O.P.'s are Not armed and do Arrest, other than Citizens Arrest.

They Patrol in Uniform, Typically in Marked Patrol Vehicles.

Some have limited authority to issue non-moving citations such as Parking.

Are trained to be good witnesses and to report suspicious or criminal activity.

Citizens On Patrol are also known as:

Citizen Observer, Action or Support Teams

Retired Senior Volunteer Patrol (RSVP's)

Auxiliary Police (non-sworn)

Neighborhood Assistance Officers

Volunteers In Police Service

(above not to be confused with the DOJ VIPS program) and many other various names across the nation!








Redlands police airplane to be equipped with video camera:

Vehicle Crime Prevention Checks & Notices





- Never leave valuable items in your vehicle that can be seen. Put all packages, phones, briefcases, gym bags, CD's, tools and any other items of value in your trunk.
- Never leave purses exposed in shopping carts, and when arriving at your vehicle, make sure your purse is the first thing you place inside, preferably on the rear seat floorboard.
- Never leave children in your vehicle unattended.
- Be alert to your surroundings as you approach your vehicle, and have your keys in your hand.
- Shop in pairs if possible, especially after dark.





Wild weather hits Inland area

STORM: Flash floods close roads and a funnel cloud damages a house.

High winds and flash floods returned Thursday afternoon to some High Desert and Inland communities still reeling after weeks of sporadic storms.

No injuries were reported when funnel clouds touched down in the Morongo Valley town of Joshua Tree, destroying one house and damaging two others, even sweeping briefly through an elementary school playground.

"It looked like a swirling mass of water . . and hail about 20 feet wide," said Cindy Arrowood, a secretary at Friendly Hills School in Joshua Tree.

In Twentynine Palms, where three residents were killed in flash flooding last month, San Bernardino County fire crews made two swift-water rescues at flooded intersections, spokeswoman Tracey Martinez said


A suspected tornado hit an unoccupied house on Melton Trail in Joshua Tree, about a mile from the elementary school. It ripped off the roof, tore out a garage door, broke windows and uprooted a nearby power pole, Martinez said.

No one was injured, Martinez said.

Lightning struck in the mountains west of Idyllwild in the afternoon, causing at least one fire that burned less than an acre before firefighters were able to put it out. Quarter-size hall was reported in the Pine Cove area.

In the desert, officials reported that heavy rains briefly closed Interstate 15 at Nipton Road, near the Nevada border.

Flooding closed about two dozen side streets off Highway 62, and forced several detours from the highway itself.
